A stop is planned at the "Looking for Lincoln Wayside Exhibit" located near Elkhart cemetery. This exhibit covers the Lincoln connection with Illinois Governor Richard J. Oglesby, who is buried in the cemetery.

Reservations are required for all tours. The cost is \$10 for adults, \$7.50 for seniors (60 and over), and \$5 for children (12 and under). Tours are limited to 16 people.
